# 6. MANAGER'S REPORT

#### Progress Report

Kim Murdoch, Town Centre Manager, presented the Progress Report for 2021/2022.

- More interruptions to events because of Covid and subsequent lockdowns: both Boys Toys and Summer Spectacular were cancelled, and the Christmas events changed to several smaller-scale activations in Phoenix Plaza and an online adaptation of the lights on the Christmas tree coming on.
- Whales Tail national event: a highlight of the summer, attracting many visitors to Browns Bay. The Browns Bay sculpture was in the top 10 most popular out of 60 sculptures around Auckland.



- Collaboration with neighbouring BIDs: Browns Bay collaborated with Mairangi Bay and Torbay Business Associations to run a series of business development and networking events.
- Investment in Marketview data: Kim Murdoch presented data on the spend in Browns Bay versus other districts around Auckland using the Marketview data.

# 12. GENERAL BUSINESS

- Kelly Walden from Erica Stanford's office advised that Beach Front Lane now has official street numbering. Businesses should obtain their street numbers from their landlords and update their signage.
- Lizzie Brandon advised the Netflix production "One of Us is Lying", which was filmed in Browns Bay, was about to become available to stream. Watching will boost the viewing numbers and may encourage the producer to commission a third season to be filmed in Browns Bay. This has been good PR for the town.



- Sam Payne of The Stoned Cow enquired about upcoming markets in Browns Bay.
   Kim Murdoch advised that there will be arts and crafts markets at Christmas events and monthly twilight markets over the summer months are being organised.
- Roy Richardson, landlord, advised that blocked drains are causing issues in properties along Clyde Road. Alexis Poppelbaum from Hibiscus and Bays Local Board undertook to raise the matter with Auckland Transport.
- Sheryl Pawley of Browns Bay Family Doctors enquired about planning for additional
  car parking in Browns Bay. Feedback was given about street parking being used by
  contractors working on developments in the town centre, making it difficult for
  employees of businesses to find unrestricted parking. Discussed potential
  introduction of paid parking. High rise parking is off the table.
